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Welcome to ORCA

Introduction

ORCA is an e-Government initiative that has been developed to replace the paper based Representations and Certifications (Reps and Certs) process. Previously, vendors had to submit Reps and Certs for each individual large purchase contract award. Now, using ORCA, a contractor can enter their Reps and Certs information once for use on all Federal contracts. This site not only benefits the contractor by allowing them to maintain an accurate and complete record but also the Contracting Officer as they can view every record, including archives, with the click of a mouse.

Background

On Oct.7, 2002 Mark Forman, then Associate Director for Information Technology and E-government, announced the five key elements in the Presidents Management Agenda in a letter to all CIO's, CFO's and Procurement Executives. This agenda was developed to improve the management and performance of the Federal Government and "outlined how we will focus our e-Government initiatives on reforming the Government so that it delivers results that matter to citizens."

The original report focused on 14 areas of improvement, 5 government- wide and 8 agency specific. Number 4 on the government wide improvement is 'Expanded Electronic Government'. In order to identify which initiatives that help create an e-Government Mr. Forman established a cross-agency task force referred to as project Quicksilver. Over a 5-week period a working group comprised of individuals knowledgeable in their agency programs and experience in government reform developed recommendations. The task force applied best of breed e-strategy methods that have been used widely in industry and government. The task force conducted 71 interviews with more than 150 senior government officials during the process to gather and identify strategic e-Government opportunities.

The task force found that the federal government could significantly improve customer service over 18 to 24 months by focusing on 23 high payoff, government wide initiatives that integrate agency operations and IT investments.

These 23 initiatives were divided into 4 categories, government to citizen (G2C), government to business (G2B), government to government (G2G), and internal effectiveness and efficiency (IEE). The Integrated Acquisition Environment (IAE) was listed as part of the IEE.

As part of the Integrated Acquisition Environment (IAE) E-Government initiative, the existing Department of Defense Central Contractor Registration system will be expanded into a Business Partner Network that and used by all agencies. The BPN will include grantees, Federal entities, and companies seeking to do business with the

Federal government. This expansion will require all those seeking to do business with the Federal government to register within the BPN.

The BPN will provide a web-enabled capability for identifying Federal and industry trading partners. It will also create a one-stop source of information about trading partners, such as Equal Employment Opportunity compliance checks, size status, the Excluded Parties List information, and past performance evaluations. The attachments to this memorandum describe the vision and benefits of the BPN as well as an overview of how it will be used for commercial acquisition, intra-governmental transactions, and grants.

ORCA was developed as a result of the Quicksilver team and deemed necessary to assist in bringing the federal government together, online. Changes to the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) that will mandate the use of the CCR and ORCA are scheduled for the upcoming months.

Vendor Instructions

Before Starting Your Application

Before you can enter ORCA you must:

- Have an active registration in Central Contractor Registration (CCR)
- Have the MPIN from your active registration
- Know your DUNS number

Registration in CCR: Before entering ORCA you must have an active registration in CCR. To determine if you have an active registration visit CCR's homepage at www.ccr.gov and click on "Search CCR" found on the left side of your screen. If you have an active registration then you can begin your ORCA record. If you do not have an existing active registration in CCR then complete one at the same website before beginning your ORCA records. Reminder: There is no cost involved with registering in CCR. When registering in CCR make sure to use 2002 NAICS codes and not 1997 NAICS codes. You may begin your ORCA questionnaire 24 hours after submitting your CCR record. 24 hours is needed because CCR data is used to feed basic company information in ORCA. Use the search function mentioned above to determine when your registration has been activated.

Marketing Partner Identification Number (MPIN): The Marketing Personal Identification Number (MPIN) is a 9-character code containing at least one alpha character and one number (no special characters or spaces). The MPIN is created, by you, in your company's CCR record and acts as a password for other various government systems, including ORCA. The MPIN is the last data field in the "Points of Contact" section of the CCR registration. Once you've entered your new MPIN into CCR, it will take 24 to 48 hours to update. After that, you can begin your registration in ORCA. Go to www.ccr.gov if you need more information on setting up your MPIN.

If you are not in CCR please go to www.ccr.gov and complete a registration. If you have an active registration but do not know your MPIN please contact the person who submitted your company's CCR registration for that information. If you do not know who that person is then contact the CCR helpdesk at 888-227-2423 for assistance.

In addition a DUNS number is needed, in conjunction with the MPIN to enter the ORCA system. If you have an active record in CCR then you have a DUNS number. You can view your active CCR record to determine your DUNS number, or if you have questions or problems with your DUNS please read the following:

***Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) Number:** The Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number is a unique nine-character identification number provided by

the commercial company Dun & Bradstreet (D&B). Call D&B at 1-866-705-5711 if you do not have a DUNS number. The process to request a DUNS number takes about 10 minutes and is free of charge. If you already have a DUNS number, the D&B representative will advise you over the phone.

DUNS +4: The use of DUNS+4 numbers to identify vendors is limited to identifying records for the same vendor at the same physical location. The +4 should only be used in ORCA if you registered your company that way in CCR.

How to Enter Your Application

If you are new to this process it is recommend that you print off the “Definition of Terms” located in Appendix A.

- Start at <http://orca.bpn.gov>
- Enter your DUNS number and MPIN, click “**Submit**”
 - Please note that after 20 minutes of inactivity on one page your registration will time out and all data will be lost.
- If you entered a valid DUNS number/MPIN combination your existing information from CCR is pulled and displayed for your review.
- Review the displayed CCR information. If correct, click “**Create ORCA Record**”.
 - If your CCR data is incorrect then visit www.ccr.gov and update your registration. Reminder: updates to CCR take 24 to 48 hours to complete and be displayed on ORCA.
- Confirm your ORCA POC and change if necessary. Click “**Continue**”.
- Questionnaire begins. Answer all the questions. To have text you entered in the questionnaire saved in the questionnaire click “**Add**”. Click “**Continue**” when finished.
 - In a few places throughout the questionnaire, you may find questions are marked with ‘Reserved’. Because of certain company information provided in your CCR record the question normally asked is no longer applicable to you. Continue on to the next question.
- Review your answers by reading the actual FAR clauses that contain your responses. If you would like to make any changes click on the check box or displayed answer to be brought back to the original question. When finished making the changes click “**Continue**” to get back to the review.
 - Remember to review and click the check boxes on the read-only clauses of 52.203-11, 52.227-6, and 52.222-38. These are the first three clauses on the review page.
- When satisfied with all your answers, scroll to the bottom of the screen and be sure to certify that your answers are true by clicking the check box. When finished, click “**Submit Certification**”.
- Download a .pdf copy of your completed Reqs and Certs record for your files.

- Please note that the information stored in an active ORCA record is considered unrestricted and is searchable by the public using the DUNS number.

You will receive an email confirmation that you have registered your record. A record is active for 365 days. The vendor needs to update their record as necessary to reflect changes, but at least annually to ensure they are kept current, accurate and complete. The record is active for 365 days from date of submission or update.

You will be reminded of the renewal requirement 60 days, 30 days and 15 days prior to your records expiration via email. The notice will be forwarded to the ORCA POC designated in your company's record.

How to Renew or Change an Active Record

Your Responsibilities

- You are responsible for ensuring the accuracy of your registration. You must use your DUNS number in conjunction with your MPIN number when making and/or requesting any changes to your profile.
- You are responsible for updating your information as it changes
- You must renew your record at least once a year. If you do not renew your record it will expire. An expired registration may affect your ability to conduct business (receive contract awards) with the government.

To initiate any changes or renew your record:

Changes can be made to your record by:

1. Go to ORCA's homepage at <http://orca.bpn.gov>
2. Enter your DUNS number and MPIN then click "**Submit**".
3. On the CCR information page click on "**Update Previously Completed Record.**"
4. Make the necessary changes then click the "**Continue**" and "**Submit Certification**" on the FAR provisions page to activate the changes.

To submit a renewal with no changes, follow the same steps listed above with the exception of making changes to your information. Reminder: you must click "**Continue**" and "**Submit Certification**" to activate the renewal, even if none of your information has changed.

If you are unsure of when your record expires you can view a read-only copy that contains the "**Date of Submission**" by:

1. Go to ORCA's homepage at www.bpn.gov/orca and click on "**Search**" then "**Current Search**".
2. Enter your DUNS number then click "**Search**".
3. Add 1 year to the "**Date of Submission**" listed to determine your expiration date.

Government Instructions

How to Search Active Records

Prior to starting, make sure you know the DUNS number of the company(s) you would like to review. If you don't know the DUNS number you can find it by going to www.ccr.gov and clicking on "**Search CCR**". Once on the search page enter the company's legal business name and click "**Search**".

If the company's name is long type in the first few letters and then click "**Search**". You will be able to choose the appropriate name from a displayed list. Click the "**Detail**" button for more information. The DUNS number is the first piece of information displayed.

Now you are ready to search ORCA.

- Start at <http://orca.bpn.gov>
- Click on "**Search**" then "**Current Search**".
- Enter the DUNS of the company you wish to find a record for, click "**Search**"
- Review the Record displayed and print a .pdf copy of the record by clicking on "**download .pdf**" found at the bottom of the page.
- To review another Record click on "**Return to Top**" then click "**Search**" then "**Current Search**".

How to Search Archived Records

As mentioned in the section above, prior to starting make sure you have the DUNS number of the company(s) you would like to review. To find the DUNS number, go to www.ccr.gov and click on “**Search CCR**”. Once on the search page enter the company’s legal business name and click “**Search**”.

If the company’s name is long, type in the first few letters and then click “**Search**”. You will be able to choose the appropriate name from a displayed list. Click the “**Detail**” button for more information. The DUNS number is the first piece of information displayed.

Now you are ready to go to ORCA.

- Start at <http://orca.bpn.gov>
- Click on “**Search**” then “**Archived Search**”.
- Enter the DUNS of the company you wish to find a record for and the dates you wish to view submitted records, click “**Submit**”.
- Review the Record displayed and print a .pdf copy of the record by clicking on “**download .pdf**” found at the bottom of the page.
- To review another Record click on “**Return to Top**” then click “**Search**” then “**Archived Search**”.

APPENDIX C

Definitions for Terms in the ORCA Questionnaire

QUESTION 1 – No definitions provided

QUESTION 2

"Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN)," as used in this provision, means the number required by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) to be used by the offeror in reporting income tax and other returns. The TIN may be either a Social Security Number or an Employer Identification Number.

QUESTION 3

"Common parent," as used in this subpart, means that corporate entity that owns or controls an affiliated group of corporations that files its Federal income tax returns on a consolidated basis, and of which the offeror is a member. (FAR 4.901)

QUESTION 4

"Debarment" means action taken by a debarring official under 9.406 to exclude a contractor from Government contracting and Government-approved subcontracting for a reasonable, specified period; a contractor that is excluded is "debarred." (FAR 2.101)

"Ineligible" means excluded from Government contracting (and subcontracting, if appropriate) pursuant to statutory, Executive order, or regulatory authority other than this regulation (48 CFR Chapter 1) and its implementing and supplementing regulations; for example, pursuant to the Davis-Bacon Act and its related statutes and implementing regulations, the Service Contract Act, the Equal Employment Opportunity Acts and Executive orders, the Walsh-Healey Public Contracts Act, the Buy American Act, or the Environmental Protection Acts and Executive orders. (FAR 2.101)

"Suspension" means action taken by a suspending official under 9.407 to disqualify a contractor temporarily from Government contracting and Government-approved subcontracting; a contractor that is disqualified is "suspended." (FAR 2.101)

QUESTION 5

"Civil judgment" means a judgment or finding of a civil offense by any court of competent jurisdiction. (FAR 9.403)

"Conviction" means a judgment or conviction of a criminal offense by any court of competent jurisdiction, whether entered upon a verdict or a plea, and includes a conviction entered upon a plea of nolo contendere. (FAR 2.101)

QUESTION 6

"Indictment" means indictment for a criminal offense. Any information or other filing by competent authority charging a criminal offense is given the same effect as an indictment. (FAR 9.403)

QUESTION 7

"Termination for default" means the exercise of the Government's right to completely or partially terminate a contract because of the contractor's actual or anticipated failure to perform its contractual obligations. (FAR 2.101)

QUESTION 8 – No definitions provided

QUESTION 9

"HUBZone" means a historically underutilized business zone that is an area located within one or more qualified census tracts, qualified nonmetropolitan counties, or lands within the external boundaries of an Indian reservation. (FAR 2.101)

"HUBZone small business concern" means a small business concern that appears on the List of Qualified HUBZone Small Business Concerns maintained by the Small Business Administration. (FAR 2.101)

QUESTION 10 – No definitions provided

QUESTION 11

"Labor surplus area" means a geographical area identified by the Department of Labor in accordance with 20 CFR part 654, subpart A, as an area of concentrated unemployment or underemployment or an area of labor surplus. (FAR 2.101)

QUESTION 12

- (ii) Where the concern is owned by one or more disadvantaged individuals, the net worth of each individual upon whom the certification is based does not exceed \$750,000 after taking into account the applicable exclusions set forth at 13 CFR 124.104(c)(2);

and

(iii) It is identified, on the date of its representation, as a certified small disadvantaged business concern in the data base maintained by the Small Business Administration (PRO-Net); or

(2) For a prime contractor, it has submitted a completed application to the Small Business Administration or a private certifier to be certified as a small disadvantaged business concern in accordance with 13 CFR part 124, subpart B, and a decision on that application is pending, and that no material change in disadvantaged ownership and control has occurred since it submitted its application. In this case, a contractor must receive certification as a small disadvantaged business by the Small Business Administration prior to contract award. (FAR 2.101)

"Caribbean Basin country end product"-

(1) Means an article that-

- (i)(A) Is wholly the growth, product, or manufacture of a Caribbean Basin country; or
- (B) In the case of an article that consists in whole or in part of materials from another country, has been substantially transformed in a Caribbean Basin country into a new and different article of commerce with a name, character, or use distinct from that of the article or articles from which it was transformed; and
- (ii) Is not excluded from duty-free treatment for Caribbean countries under 19 U.S.C. 2703(b).

(A) For this reason, the following articles are not Caribbean Basin country end products:

- (1) Tuna, prepared or preserved in any manner in airtight containers.
- (2) Petroleum, or any product derived from petroleum.
- (3) Watches and watch parts (including cases, bracelets, and straps) of whatever type including, but not limited to, mechanical, quartz digital, or quartz analog, if such watches or watch parts contain any material that is the product of any country to which the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) column 2 rates of duty apply (i.e., Afghanistan, Cuba, Laos, North Korea, and Vietnam).
- (4) Certain of the following: textiles and apparel articles; footwear, handbags, luggage, flat goods, work gloves, and leather wearing apparel; or handloomed, handmade, and folklore articles.

(2) Refers to a product offered for purchase under a supply contract, but for purposes of calculating the value of the acquisition, includes services (except transportation services) incidental to the article, provided that the value of those incidental services does not exceed that of the article itself.
"Component" means an article, material, or supply incorporated directly into an end product or construction material.

"Cost of components" means-

(1) For components purchased by the contractor, the acquisition cost, including transportation costs to the place of incorporation into the end product or construction material (whether or not such costs are paid to a domestic firm), and any applicable duty (whether or not a duty-free entry certificate is issued); or
(2) For components manufactured by the contractor, all costs associated with the manufacture of the component, including transportation costs as described in paragraph (1) of this definition, plus allocable overhead costs, but excluding profit. Cost of components does not include any costs associated with the manufacture of the end product.

"Designated country" means any of the following countries:

(1) A World Trade Organization Government Procurement Agreement country (Aruba, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hong Kong, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Korea (Republic of), Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Singapore, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, or United Kingdom);
(2) A Free Trade Agreement country (Australia, Canada, Chile, Mexico, Morocco, or Singapore);
(3) A least developed country (Afghanistan, Angola, Bangladesh, Benin, Bhutan, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cambodia, Cape Verde, Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Democratic Republic of Congo, Djibouti, East Timor, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Haiti, Kiribati, Laos, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Maldives, Mali, Mauritania, Mozambique, Nepal, Niger, Rwanda, Samoa, Sao Tome and Principe, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Solomon Islands, Somalia, Tanzania, Togo, Tuvalu, Uganda, Vanuatu, Yemen, or Zambia); or
(4) A Caribbean Basin country (Antigua and Barbuda, Aruba, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, British Virgin Islands, Costa Rica, Dominica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Grenada, Guatemala, Guyana, Haiti, Honduras, Jamaica, Montserrat, Netherlands

Antilles, Nicaragua, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, or Trinidad and Tobago).

"Designated country end product" means a WTO GPA country end product, an FTA country end product, a least developed country end product, or a Caribbean Basin country end product.

"Domestic end product" means-

(1) An unmanufactured end product mined or produced in the United States; or
(2) An end product manufactured in the United States, if the cost of its components mined, produced, or manufactured in the United States exceeds 50 percent of the cost of all its components. Components of foreign origin of the same class or kind as those that the agency determines are not mined, produced, or manufactured in sufficient and reasonably available commercial quantities of a satisfactory quality are treated as domestic. Scrap generated, collected, and prepared for processing in the United States is considered domestic.

"Domestic offer" means an offer of a domestic end product. When the solicitation specifies that award will be made on a group of line items, a domestic offer means an offer where the proposed price of the domestic end products exceeds 50 percent of the total proposed price of the group.

"Eligible offer" means an offer of an eligible product. When the solicitation specifies that award will be made on a group of line items, an eligible offer means a foreign offer where the combined proposed price of the eligible products and the domestic end products exceeds 50 percent of the total proposed price of the group.

"Eligible product" means a foreign end product, construction material, or service that, due to applicability of a trade agreement to a particular acquisition, is not subject to discriminatory treatment.

"End product" means those articles, materials, and supplies to be acquired for public use.

"Free Trade Agreement country" means Australia, Canada, Chile, Mexico, Morocco or Singapore.

"Free Trade Agreement country end product" means an article that-

(1) Is wholly the growth, product, or manufacture of a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) country; or
(2) In the case of an article that consists in whole or in part of materials from another country, has been substantially transformed in an FTA country into a new and different article of commerce with a name, character, or use distinct from that of the article or articles from which it was transformed. The term refers to a product offered for purchase under a supply contract, but for purposes of calculating the value of the end product,

includes services (except transportation services) incidental to the article, provided that the value of those incidental services does not exceed that of the article itself.

"Foreign contractor" means a contractor or subcontractor organized or existing under the laws of a country other than the United States.

"Foreign end product" means an end product other than a domestic end product.

"Foreign offer" means any offer other than a domestic offer.

"Israeli end product" means an article that-

(1) Is wholly the growth, product, or manufacture of Israel; or

(2) In the case of an article that consists in whole or in part of materials from another country, has been substantially transformed in Israel into a new and different article of commerce with a name, character, or use distinct from that of the article or articles from which it was transformed.

"Least developed country" means any of the following countries: Afghanistan, Angola, Bangladesh, Benin, Bhutan, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cambodia, Cape Verde, Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Democratic Republic of Congo, Djibouti, East Timor, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Haiti, Kiribati, Laos, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Maldives, Mali, Mauritania, Mozambique, Nepal, Niger, Rwanda, Samoa, Sao Tome and Principe, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Solomon Islands, Somalia, Tanzania, Togo, Tuvalu, Uganda, Vanuatu, Yemen, or Zambia.

"Least developed country end product" means an article that-

(1) Is wholly the growth, product, or manufacture of a least developed country; or

(2) In the case of an article that consists in whole or in part of materials from another country, has been substantially transformed in a least developed country into a new and different article of commerce with a name, character, or use distinct from that of the article or articles from which it was transformed. The term refers to a product offered for purchase under a supply contract, but for purposes of calculating the value of the end product, includes services (except transportation services) incidental to the article, provided that the value of those incidental services does not exceed that of the article itself.

"Noneligible offer" means an offer of a noneligible product.

"Noneligible product" means a foreign end product that is not an eligible product.

"United States" means the 50 States, the District of Columbia, and outlying areas.

"U.S.-made end product" means an article that is mined, produced, or manufactured in the United States or that is substantially transformed in the United States into a new and different article of commerce with a name, character, or use distinct from that of the article or articles from which it was transformed.

"World Trade Organization Government Procurement Agreement (WTO GPA) country" means any of the following countries: Aruba, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hong Kong, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Korea (Republic of), Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Singapore, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, or United Kingdom.

"WTO GPA country end product" means an article that-

(1) Is wholly the growth, product, or manufacture of a WTO GPA country; or
(2) In the case of an article that consists in whole or in part of materials from another country, has been substantially transformed in a WTO GPA country into a new and different article of commerce with a name, character, or use distinct from that of the article or articles from which it was transformed. The term refers to a product offered for purchase under a supply contract, but for purposes of calculating the value of the end product includes services (except transportation services) incidental to the article, provided that the value of those incidental services does not exceed that of the article itself.

QUESTION 23

"Data" means recorded information, regardless of form or the media on which it may be recorded. The term includes technical data and computer software.
